LATIN AMERICAN YOUTH CENTER TEAMS WITH INTERNATIONAL ARTIST TO DEVELOP UNIQUE JEWELRY *D.C. Children and Gary Rosenthal Collection Create Special Mother's Day Jewelry; As Kindred Spirit Set to Sell Gifts, Central Wholesalers to Donate Jewelry*

WASHINGTON, D.C., March 16, 2005 – A local youth center has teamed up with an internationally renowned artist and a local retailer to create one-of-a-kind jewelry in a socially responsible business/community collaboration.

The Latin American Youth Center is working with the Gary Rosenthal Collection and the Art as a Catalyst™ program this spring to create special pins, pendants and other jewelry made with the help of children in the nation's capital. The initiative has already gained the support of As Kindred Spirit and Central Wholesalers, Inc.

Several afternoons over the next two months leading up to Mother's Day on Sunday, May 8, 2005, children and mothers will gather with Gary Rosenthal at the Latin American Youth Center to create the glasswork featured on the jewelry. The glass will be "fired" and completed at Rosenthal's workshop in Kensington, Md. **A special mother-daughter tea and jewelry-making session will be held on Saturday, April 30 at 10 a.m. – one week prior to Mother's Day.**

Each piece of jewelry costs \$20 with a portion of the proceeds benefiting the Latin American Youth Center and the Gary Rosenthal Foundation's Art as a Catalyst™ program. The Latin American Youth Center is looking to raise \$750,000 to convert a Columbia Heights building into four independent living units for teen mothers and their children. Currently, Washington, D.C. does not have a bilingual, bicultural teen mother's residential program.

The jewelry will be available through the Latin American Youth Center Web site (www.layc-dc.org) and through As Kindred Spirit retail stores with locations in Rockville, Md., Reagan National Airport and Pentagon Row (Arlington, Va.).

Gary Rosenthal said: “I have long believed that art can be a catalyst to build community and promote arts enrichment. We are optimistic that the local community and corporate partners will support this effort to raise the \$750,000 needed for Washington, D.C.’s first residential program for the District’s teen mothers.”
